This was the third conference in the series. The first two conferences were held in December at the Indian Statistical Institute, Kolkata

ICIAR 2006, the International Conference on Image Analysis and Recognition, was the third ICIAR conference, and was held in Póvoa de Varzim, Portugal.

ICIAR is organized annually, and alternates between Europe and North America. ICIAR 2004 was held in Porto, Portugal and ICIAR 2005 in Toronto, Canada. The idea of offering these conferences came as a result of discussion between researchers in Portugal and Canada to encourage collaboration and exchange, mainly between these two countries, but also with the open participation of other countries, addressing recent advances in theory, methodology and applications. The response to the call for papers for ICIAR 2006 was higher than the two

previous editions. From 389 full papers submitted, 163 were finally accepted (71 oral presentations, and 92 posters). The review process was carried out by the Program Committee members and other reviewers; all are experts in various image analysis and recognition areas. Each paper was reviewed by at least two reviewers, and also checked by the conference Co-chairs. The high quality of the papers in these proceedings is attributed first to the authors, and second to the quality of the reviews provided by the experts. It is this collective effort that resulted in the strong conference program and high-

quality proceedings in your hands.

from combinatorics, probability and geometry to partial differential equations. All authors are gifted expositors and are current contributors to the field. The wide scope of the volume includes research problems, research tools and good motivational material for teaching.

Subsequent chapters deal with various applications of generalized inverses, including programming, games, and networks, as well as estimation and aggregation in econometrics. This monograph will be of interest to mathematicians and students of mathematics.
