Concepts considered as important for guidance teaching include normal development; group dynamics; individual needs, self-esteem, indicators of distress, and affective education concepts. Although this series expresses and fosters Christian values, it is not intended to replace religion classes. It is hoped that these volumes will help the teacher integrate value and guidance in instruction and thus enhance the growth of the total person. (RJM)
