Many books explore baptism from doctrinal or theological perspectives, and focus on issues such as the correct mode of baptism, the proper candidate for baptism, who has the authority to baptize, and whether or not baptism is a symbol or means of grace. By contrast, *Caesar and the Sacrament* investigates the political nature of baptism. Very few contemporary Christians consider baptism's original purpose
