The Cornell edition, the first English translation, is enhanced by 23 illustrations. Traunecker begins with an overview of the source materials and a discussion of the historiography of Egyptian religion, a subject

relatively neglected by scholars. He then describes the actual and metaphysical worlds inhabited by the Egyptian deities and the role that humans played in the Egyptian universe.

Focusing especially on the diversity and number of approaches used by Egyptians to explain their world, *The Gods of Egypt* offers a succinct and highly readable presentation of recent interpretations of Egyptian religion.
