This book is an interesting examination of how the discourses of military literature and war films construct the subject, namely "nation". The Indian nation faces a multi-pronged attack from neighbouring countries that seek territorial

aggrandizement, the forces of liberalization (economic and cultural), and from secessionist forces within the nation. In the face of such an attack, a plethora of discourses engages seriously in constructing an idea of the Indian nation and reinforcing the notion of an Indian identity.
