Agricultural Education remains fundamental to civilization. It is the most consistent productive income of Australia, which is one of the world's very few net agricultural exporters. Victoria, with only about three percent of the Australia's area, has been its major source of agricultural output. These three factors – underpinning civilization, creating wealth, and intensity in south-eastern Australia – make Victorian agriculture and its

education of national importance and international significance.
