California law does not specify a level of supervision that is required except for furnishing drugs or devices. California Scope of Practice Policy - State Profile "nurse protocol". The nurse protocol is a written document in which the physician gives the NP authority to perform medical acts and also agrees to be available for immediate consultation with the nurse practitioner.
