copies circulated after his death added to the corruption of the text by contributing errors of their own. Now Peters is publishing a new urtext edition of this staple of the choral repertoire, edited by David Black. The edition relies on Mozart's composition and the traditional completion by Franz Xaver Süssmayr. For the first time, however, it incorporates sources previously

unavailable to earlier editions, including the Neue Mozart-Ausgabe. *Mozart - Selected Variations (Songbook)* Courier Corporation Written between 1887 and 1890, Gabriel Faure's setting of the requiem is a departure from traditional structure. Faure said the following of his work: "It has been said that my Requiem does not express the fear of death and

someone has called it a lullaby of death. But it is thus that I see death: as a happy deliverance, an aspiration towards happiness above, rather than as a painful experience." How Lovely Is Thy Dwelling Place (from Requiem)

Forgotten Books Mozart showed amazing talent from early in childhood. Already

competent on the keyboard and violin, he started composing from the age of five and performed before European royalty. At 17, he was enlisted as a court musician in Salzburg, but grew restless of this and decided to travel in search of a better position, always composing abundantly. The Requiem Mass in D minor was composed in Vienna in 1791 and was left unfinished

when Mozart died on December 5th 1791. A completion dated 1792 by Franz Xaver Süssmayr was delivered to Count Franz von Walsegg, who had anonymously commissioned the piece for a requiem mass to commemorate the February 14th anniversary of his wife's death. A facsimile sheet of music from the Dies Irae movement of the "Requiem Mass in D Minor" (K. 626) in

Mozart's own handwriting. It is located at the Mozarthaus in Vienna.

The present edition is the second volume of three.
Collectively, these editions form a critical anthology of requiem masses composed by musicians of St. Mark's, Venice over a long period extending from the late sixteenth century to the closing years of the nineteenth century. The featured musician of this volume is Ferdinando Bertoni (1725–1813), who was much celebrated during the classical period as a composer of both sacred and secular music and who gained significant exposure as the master of music at St. Mark's. Most of the music in the edition can be firmly connected to the funeral of the heroic Admiral Angelo Emo (1731–92), which was held in St. Mark's during 1792. Emo was no ordinary Venetian: he was Venice's last admiral to lead La Serenissima into battle and a Procuratore de ultra of St. Mark's, a position placing him in the tier immediately below the ruling doge, Lodovico Manin. The music assembled here for the first time in a

modern critical edition is a valuable relic of this temporal juncture in the history, not only of the ducal church, but of Venice broadly. The requiem stands as one of the last outstandingly sumptuous works performed at the ducal church before Venice's fall from grace in the closing years of the eighteenth century. With its kaleidoscopic mixture of styles, the work may sit comfortably

as the showpiece in a concert program, or, authentically, as the musical backbone of an ecclesiastical setting, as it was originally intended. *Requiem, for Four Solo Voices and Chorus* Edition Peters Mozart's Requiem Mass in D Minor, K.626, as we now have it, is actually the work of several composers since Mozart died before its completion. It is especially puzzling because of the
