Er is veel bekend over de ziekte diabetes. Maar hoe is het om dag in dag uit te leven met de ziekte? En hoe kunnen kinderen, ouders en behandelaars (beter) samenwerken om het leven met diabetes zo aangenaam mogelijk te maken? Christine Dedding studeerde medische antropologie aan de Universiteit van Amsterdam. In haar onderzoeken staan onderwerpen op het raakvlak van antropologie en geneeskunde centraal. Haar interesse gaat vooral uit naar de vraag hoe mensen hun leven met een ziekte vormgeven en naar de samenwerking tussen patiënten en behandelaars. Door kinderen met diabetes zelf in het onderzoek te betrekken, kreeg zij diepgaand inzicht in de beleving van kinderen, het 'ziekenwerk' dat zij verzetten in het leven van alledag, de problemen die zij ervaren, de mate waarin kinderen en volwassenen met elkaar willen en kunnen samenwerken en de vraag wat een goede samenwerking in de weg staat. In 'De mondigheid van kinderen uit zich vaak in stilte' staan de perspectieven en ervaringen van kinderen centraal. Het boek biedt behandelaars een nieuwe ingang om te reflecteren op de zorg voor kinderen in hun eigen praktijk. Ouders en mensen die zelf diabetes hebben, vinden ongetwijfeld veel herkenning in de verhalen van kinderen. 'Ik denk dat jij als niet-diabeet heel dicht ben gekomen bij echt begrip van wat het is om diabetes te hebben, voor een kind en ook voor een volwassene'. 'Ik zie voornamelijk overeenkomsten met mijn eigen belang als volwassen diabeet. Dat betekent dat kinderen uitstekend in staat zijn om te zeggen wat belangrijk voor hen is, en waar het aan schort'. Direct herkenbaar zijn: het leven met diabetes als 'ziekenwerk', ofwel een continue, zware klus waar je nooit vrij van hebt; diabetes als 'kooi die met je meegaat'; artsen weten niet hoe het is om ermee te leven; overig onbegrip in de omgeving; de lastige balans tussen het medisch-technisch optimum- lage HbA1c- en een prettig sociaal functioneren; de frustratie bij slechte waarden; (zelden uitgesproken) zorgen over de toekomst; en moeders die het meeste werk doen.... (H.K., zelf ervaringsdeskundige en ouder van een kind met diabetes).

Eric-Emmanuel Schmitt is the author of three luminous collections of short stories published by Europa Editions, including the bestselling Most Beautiful Book in the World, and the novel, Three Women in a Mirror. The questions at the center of all of these delightful works is the same: What is happiness and how do we attain it? In this latest collection, two young lovers secretly adore the child they can never have; an esteemed physician and survivor of the Nazi concentration camps finds inner peace thanks to the love of a faithful dog; a man loves his wife through the memories of her first husband; and a mother rediscovers love for her child when someone tries to take that child from her. And finally, Séverine and Benjamin understand that they have lost the love of their lives when they see themselves through the eyes of a young terminally ill girl. **The Runaway Family** Uitgeverij Ten Have

The story of a tempestuous love affair—and the basis for Paul Verhoeven's Oscar-nominated film—Wolkers's controversial masterpiece comes alive in a new translation. Upon its original publication in 1969, *Turkish Delight* was a sensation and a scandal. Its graphic language and explicit sex scenes had an explosive effect, but just as revolutionary was its frank, colloquial style. The more straightlaced critics condemned the book, but readers saw a novel that reflected the way that they spoke, thought, and felt. *Turkish Delight* opens with a screed: a sculptor in his studio, raging against the love he lost and describing, in gory detail, the state of his life since she left him. Our narrator alternates between the story of his relationship with Olga—its passion and affection, but also its obsessiveness and abuse—and the dark days that followed, as he attempts to recapture what they had when they lived together, “happy as beasts.” The two only reunite during Olga's inexorable and tragic decline into cancer—the chemo having taken her hair and rotted her teeth, she will only eat the soft, sweet *Turkish Delight* that her ex-lover brings to her bedside. In a new translation by Sam Garrett (Herman Koch's *The Dinner*), readers get a sense of Wolkers's revolutionary style and musical prose, *Turkish Delight*'s particular balance of naked impulse and profound longing. *Treasure of Khan* Atlantic Books

Translation and film adaptation of theatre have received little study.
