One day the intrepid Oedipus approached Thebes to be met by the sphinx and asked her riddle. Much to her chagrin, Oedipus answered correctly: whereupon she destroyed herself. But what, exactly, was the riddle of the sphinx? The top contender is a variation of the following: "What creature walks on four legs in the morning, two legs at noon, and three legs in the evening?" But in other versions of the story, the sphinx asks a different riddle, or even multiple riddles. Without pretending to adjudicate between different story variants, this collection includes the top three riddles that I uncovered in my background reading. Any or all of them may have been asked of Oedipus. Read on to discover all of the Riddles of the Sphinx!
