As he tells the exciting story of *The Adventures of Harold Mouse*, Key embellishes the tale with actions and slowly brings a ray of light into what had been a sad, dark time for the Railway Mice. storyteller? Only time will tell. One thing for sure though, is Key's ability to keep everyone entertained with his bright and cheery personality.
