 Ages & Stages of Numeracy Development Newborn to 4 months old • Can tell the difference between a picture of two dots and a picture of three dots. • Can immediately “see” that there are two or three dots on a page, even though the ability to count is not yet developed.

 The transition between young childhood and young adulthood is an exciting period of self-discovery and development. Between the ages of 7 and 16, children go through 3 distinct stages of child development: middle childhood, early adolescence and middle adolescence 1 2. Throughout these formative years, children gain self-esteem and a sense of identity, experience dramatic physical changes and develop interests and abilities that can last a lifetime.
 The Stages of Child Development Between 7 and 16 Years Old
 Numeracy. Children around 6 years of age learn to generate numbers with decade structures (i.e., teens, twenties), understand what numbers mean, learn to count increasingly large sets of objects, understand that the last number of a count is the number of objects in a set, and understand how to add and subtract.

 Types of numeracy skills 5-6 year olds can display. Children who are 5-6 years of age are counting to 30 and able to represent numbers to 20. This means that they can link the number of objects to the numeral. Children are grouping objects into sets and learning to count by ones to determine the size of each set.
