The primacy of words  
over images has deep  
roots in Western culture.  
But what if the two are  
inextricably linked, equal  
partners in meaning-

making? Written and  
drawn entirely as comics,  
Unflattening is an  
experiment in visual  
thinking. Nick Sousanis  
defies conventional forms  
of scholarly discourse to

art and a serious inquiry  
into the ways humans  
construct knowledge.  
Unflattening is an  
insurrection against the

fixed viewpoint. Weaving  
together diverse ways of  
seeing drawn from  
science, philosophy, art,  
literature, and mythology,  
it uses the collage-like  
capacity of comics to  
show that perception is  
always an active process  
of incorporating and  
reevaluating different  
vantage points. While its  
vibrant, constantly  
morphing images

occasionally serve as illustrations of text, they more often connect in nonlinear fashion to other visual references throughout the book. They become allusions, allegories, and motifs, pitting realism against abstraction and making us aware that more meets the eye than is presented on the page. In its graphic innovations and restless shape-shifting, *Unflattening* is meant to counteract the type of narrow, rigid thinking that Sousanis calls “flatness.” Just as the two-

dimensional inhabitants of Edwin A. Abbott’s novella *Flatland* could not fathom the concept of “upwards,” Sousanis says, we are often unable to see past the boundaries of our current frame of mind. Fusing words and images to produce new forms of knowledge, *Unflattening* teaches us how to access modes of understanding beyond what we normally apprehend. *Main Street Createspace Independent Publishing Platform*

This is the autobiography of Abdul Salam Zaeef, a senior former member of

the Taliban. His memoirs, translated from Pashto, are more than just a personal account of his extraordinary life. My Life with the Taliban offers a counter-narrative to the standard accounts of Afghanistan since 1979. Zaeef describes growing up in rural poverty in Kandahar province. Both of his parents died at an early age, and the Russian invasion of 1979 forced him to flee to Pakistan. He started fighting the jihad in 1983, during which time he was associated with many

major figures in the anti-Soviet resistance, including the current Taliban head Mullah Mohammad Omar. After the war Zaeef returned to a quiet life in a small village in Kandahar, but chaos soon overwhelmed Afghanistan as factional fighting erupted after the Russians pulled out. Disgusted by the lawlessness that ensued, Zaeef was one among the former mujahidin who were closely involved in the discussions that led to the emergence of the Taliban, in 1994. Zaeef

then details his Taliban career as civil servant and minister who negotiated with foreign oil companies as well as with Afghanistan's own resistance leader, Ahmed Shah Massoud. Zaeef was ambassador to Pakistan at the time of the 9/11 attacks, and his account discusses the strange "phoney war" period before the US-led intervention toppled the Taliban. In early 2002 Zaeef was handed over to American forces in Pakistan, notwithstanding his diplomatic status, and

spent four and a half years in prison (including several years in Guantanamo) before being released without having been tried or charged with any offence. *My Life with the Taliban* offers a personal and privileged insight into the rural Pashtun village communities that are the Taliban's bedrock. It helps to explain what drives men like Zaeef to take up arms against the foreigners who are foolish enough to invade his homeland.

The challenges of providing palliative care in this setting are different to those in more developed countries, contending with the shortage of physical and human resources in addition to the vast scope of the care needed.
